How To Get A Hydrangea To Flower - Why Aren't My ...

For true blue flowers, the hydrangeas need to be grown in acidic soil with a pH of 5.5 or lower. For pink flowers, the plants need neutral to alkaline soils (pH 6.5 and higher). For purple blooms (or a mix of blue and pink flowers on the same plant), the pH of the soil must be between pH 5.5 and 6.5.

Changing Blue Hydrangeas Pink and Vice Versa - These bushes will bear blue flowers in acid soils, but pink blooms in alkaline ground. If a soil test reveals insufficient acidity and you desire a blue color, just raise acidity. Happily, it is very easy to change a bigleaf hydrangea's color to either pink or blue, depending upon what you want it to be.

Leading with a specific hue means it's easier to identify which flower options you have, then you can narrow down the best stems by season. For example, hydrangea grows in range of beautiful blue shades but it usually blooms from late spring through the summer, meaning the cost per stem might cost more for a winter wedding.

Keep your soil on the acidic side if you want to achieve the bluest blooms possible from your 'Nikko Blue' hydrangea bush. This mophead variety blooms earlier than most, usually beginning in June and endures for two months. Provide winter protection in zone 5, as flowers are produced on old wood.

Pruning Common Hydrangeas. The most common garden hydrangea shrub is the Bigleaf variety, Hydrangea macrophylla. (See more below.) Bigleaf (H. macrophylla), Oakleaf (H. quercifolia), Mountain (H. serrata), and Climbing hydrangeas (H. anomala subsp. petiolaris) are pruned AFTER the flowers fade in the summer. These varieties bloom on the previous season's stems ("old wood").

Both French hydrangeas (Hydrangea macrophylla) and lacecaps (Hydrangea macrophylla normalis) form flower buds during the summer — a whole year before plants bloom. For once-blooming hydrangeas, pruning during late summer, fall or in early spring the following year can remove flower buds.

But keep in mind, not all hydrangea types are capable of color adjustments. Bigleaf hydrangeas, H. macrophylla, react to changes in soil pH. A low soil pH allows hydrangeas to absorb aluminum, which turns the flowers a beautiful blue color. To increase blue hydrangea flowers, lower your soil pH by adding sulfur or peat moss to the soil.

My other blue hydrangea is a lacecap-type, called 'Let's Dance Starlight', but instead of the huge, mophead-type of flower cluster that 'Endless Summer' has, the lacecap hydrangea bears a flat blossom made up of many small, fertile flowers surrounded by a few showy, sterile flowers.

In addition to inappropriate pruning, the main cause of these Hydrangeas not blooming is cold winter or early spring temperatures. If the temperatures drop into the single digits for very long, those flower buds get zapped. If the buds are swelling in the early spring, and the temperature drops into the 20's, they are also killed.
